**"HISTORY COMES ALIVE!"**

Fort Ticonderoga and the Flynn Center for the Performing Arts (Burlington, Vermont) team together to present "History Comes Alive!," a day-long theater camp on Thursday, August 12, 2010, for children entering grades 4 through 8. Travel back in time to 1775 and imagine you are one of the Green Mountain Boys trying to decide whether to follow Ethan Allen and Benedict Arnold across Lake Champlain to attack Fort Ticonderoga. Imagine you are one of the family members of the British soldiers living in the fort and unaware of this plan. Over the course of the day participants, with the help of simple costume pieces, will create characters, both true and fictional, as they enact the historic capture of Fort Ticonderoga of May 10, 1775. The day will conclude with an informal presentation of the day's highlights for families, friends, and fort visitors on the Fort's historic Parade Ground.

Joan Robinson, associate director for school programs at the Flynn Center, will lead the day camp. Joan created and directs the "Words Come Alive!" program at the Flynn, training teachers to bring their curriculum to life through drama and movement. More than 30 years of experience performing, teaching, and storytelling inform her work at the Flynn and at St. Michael's College, where she teaches in the graduate program in education.
